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INTERNATIONAL EVENTS AND COLLABORATIONS

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Expanding Horizons: Delegation from Zhejiang Shuren University, China to the University of Sri Jayewardenepura

The University of Sri Jayewardenepura is a well-known higher educational institute worldwide with over 100s of international collaborations. Zhejiang Shuren University, China is one of the pioneers that our university has partnerships over the years. As a result of this prolonged mutual understanding and friendship between the two institutions, the University of Sri Jayewardenepura had the privilege of welcoming the delegation from Zhejiang Shuren University, China on 22nd October 2024. The Vice-Chancellor, Senior Professor M.M. Pathmalal, and Deans of the Faculties, Research Council, Innovation, Invention and Venture Creations Council, senior academic staff members and the administrative officers graciously welcomed them to the university.

During this visit, 06 delegates from the Zhejiang Shuren University visited the University of Sri Jayewardenepura including Vice-President Professor Chen Jun, Professor Liu Weiping (Dean, Interdisciplinary Research Academy), Mrs. Zhao Rui (Deputy Dean, School of Humanities and Foreign Languages), Associate Professor Huang Qiubo (School of Economics and Social Welfare), Associate Professor Yin Shanshan (Interdisciplinary Research Academy) and Ms. Olivia Liu Jiani (Officer of International Affairs).

The visit had three key objectives, reflecting the deepening ties between our institutions:

• Awarding an Honorary Professorship to the Vice-Chancellor:

- In recognition of the leadership and contributions to academia, expertise in research projects, national and international collaborations and research publications, Zhejiang Shuren University has recognized our Vice-Chancellor, Senior Professor M.M. Pathmalal to be awarded the Honorary Professorship in Interdisciplinary Research Academy of their university. This prestigious recognition highlights the ongoing academic and research collaboration between our universities.

• Opening of the Chinese Language and Cultural Centre:

- As part of a framework agreement on the joint establishment of the Silk Road Academy, the delegation formally inaugurated the Chinese Language and Cultural Centre at the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences. This center aims to foster cultural exchange and language learning, strengthening the bond between Sri Lanka and China. In response to the Belt and Road initiative, adhering to the Silk Road spirit of peace and cooperation, openness and inclusiveness, mutual learning and mutual benefit, both universities will deeply promote and fully integrate the resources of the two universities, with full attention to mutual advantages in scientific research, talent sharing, cultural exchanges and other possible avenues.





• <u>Exploring New Initiatives and Facilities in E-Commerce:</u>

- The delegation toured the newly built Faculty Complex of the Faculty of Management Studies and Commerce. In addition, discussions were held regarding the initiation of e-commerce-based internship programs, providing valuable opportunities for students.

• <u>Establishment of an International Joint Laboratory on Environmental Exposure and</u> <u>Health Research:</u>

- A significant outcome of the visit was the agreement to establish an international joint laboratory focused on environmental exposure and health research, further cementing our commitment to collaborative research. Both universities will jointly develop or initiate appropriate collaborative projects to facilitate the start-up and long-term development of the joint laboratory and both sides will work together to secure funding for future collaborative research and international collaborative joint funding programmes.



The visit was enlightened by the cultural show organized by the students of the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences. The Chinese delegates will visit some places in Sri Lanka during their stay here to witness the beauty of Sri Lanka. Two outstanding undergraduates from the University of Sri Jayewardenepura, Mr. Anupa Indira Liyanagunawardana (Faculty of Management Studies and Commerce – Fourth Year) and Ms. Praveena Saparamadu (Faculty of Applied Sciences – Third Year), proudly represented the university at Vibrance'25 – the annual cultural and sports festival organized by Vellore Institute of Technology (VIT), Chennai, India.

A Remarkable Student Experience:- Vibrance'25, held from February 26th to March 1st, 2025, was a dynamic celebration of diverse cultures and sporting talents. The festival gathered over 40 participants from 16 different countries, providing a unique platform for students to interact, compete, and immerse themselves in a vibrant international atmosphere. Participants engaged in cultural performances, sports events, gaming competitions, and recreational activities. The festival was further enriched with daily concerts featuring popular artists such as Armaan Malik, Shakthisree Gopalan, Devi Sri Prasad, and Julia Bliss. A major highlight was Videsh – Cultural Clash Showdown on February 28, where international students showcased their traditional performances at the Nethaji Auditorium. In addition to the festival, VIT Chennai offered short-term academic courses. All Sri Lankan participants took part in AI and Machine Learning and Indian Culture courses under Slot II, benefiting from engaging lectures and hands-on experiences in robotics, drone, and audio laboratories. Furthermore, students participated in yoga and mindfulness sessions, fostering personal growth and wellbeing.





Exploring India:- Beyond academics and cultural events, the students explored historical and modern attractions, visiting Mahabalipuram, a UNESCO World Heritage site that emerged after a tsunami, and engaging in leisure activities at Marina Mall and Phoenix Mall.

Outstanding Achievements:- Praveena Saparamadu participated in the basketball tournament, where her team emerged as champions, and she was honored as the Best Shooter of the tournament. Anupa Liyanagunawardana took part in the mini marathon, securing a position among the top 20 finishers. Both students represented Sri Lanka at Videsh – Cultural Clash Showdown, performing a traditional dance that captivated the audience. New Platform for Global Growth" forum in Moscow, Russia (April 27 - May 2, 2025). Her essay on **"Investments in Environment** - **Creating the Pathway to a Better Global Growth"** made her chosen as a finalist from among 696 submissions spanning 102 countries. This recognition provided the opportunity to present her ideas at the in-person stage of the competition hosted by the National Centre Russia in Moscow. Ms. Apeksha could share her presentation advanced through several rounds of evaluation, placing her among the top 06 finalists in her category and ultimately securing 03rd place in the final round. This achievement not only validates perseverance but also brings international recognition to Sri Lanka's contributions to environmental sustainability discourse.

Strengthening Global Research Ties: Teesside University Vice-Chancellor Visits University of Sri Jayewardenepura

Key objectives of the visit included:

- Enhancing Research Collaborations Encouraging joint research activities, publications, and the exchange of scholarly ideas between both universities.
- **Facilitating Research Scholar Visits** Exploring research exchange programs, particularly in the field of Molecular and Biological Sciences.
- **Supporting Transnational Education** Providing academic research support for students enrolled in Teesside University's Master's Degree program at BMS Campus, Sri Lanka, with a future Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) between BMS Campus and the University of Sri Jayewardenepura.
- Establishing a Three-Year Agreement/ Memorandum of Understanding To formalize collaboration for an initial period of three years, both universities will enter into a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with periodic reviews and an option for renewal or discontinuation by either party with a 12-month notice.



In the evening of the same day, the signing ceremony of the Expression of Interest (EOI) was held at the British High Commission Office, Colombo, marking a significant step towards a long-term academic partnership. Senior Prof. M.M. Pathmalal, Vice-Chancellor of our university and Dr. Ruwini Dharmawardene, the Director of International Affairs Division joined this signing ceremony representing the university.

Fostering International Educational Collaboration: Hosting a Delegation from Irkutsk National Research Technical University

Established in 1930, INRTU stands as a beacon of academic excellence and innovation in Russia's educational landscape. As one of the designated national research universities in Russia, it serves as a center for science, culture, and education in the Irkutsk region. The university has gained international recognition through its presence in prestigious global rankings, which reflect INRTU's commitment to academic quality, research output, and global engagement in higher education.

Times Higher Education (THE) World University Rankings: 1501+, THE Engineering Rankings: 1251+, THE Impact Rankings: 401-600, QS World University Rankings: 301-350 The visiting delegation comprised key leadership figures from INRTU's international affairs division: Stepan Bykov - Vice-Rector for International Affairs, who oversees the university's global partnerships and international strategy, Anna Melenteva – Head of the International Affairs Department, responsible for implementing the university's international programs, Klimently Batoroev – Advisor to Vice-Rector, providing strategic guidance on international collaborations, Elizaveta Ivanova - Specialist of the International Affairs Department, managing operational aspects of international programs. This visit marks the beginning of what promises to be a fruitful relationship between our institutions. The delegation expressed keen interest in formalizing collaborative frameworks through potential memoranda of understanding and specific project agreements. The engagement with INRTU opens doors to Russia's extensive higher education network and creates pathways for academic and research partnerships in the Eurasian region. "ISSUES IN TRANSLATION OF BUDDHIST TEXTS: FROM TRANSLATION TO INTERPRETATION"

A proposal was put forth for a collaborative effort with Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences (Department of Pali and Buddhist Studies), University of Sri Jayewardenepura to convene a roundtable discussion, on Languages of the Buddhist World, during the second part of 2025 with the Foundation for Promotion of Buddhist Education and Research, Russian Federation. Accordingly, the first round table discussion session was held on 23rd of June via virtual platform, which was moderated by Dr. Ruwini Dharmawardene, Director of the International Affairs Division.

The discussion concentrated on the challenges inherent in the translation of Buddhist terminology across the languages of the Buddhist world (Sanskrit and Pali, Chinese, Tibetan, Japanese, Sinhalese, Tamil, etc.) into European languages, Russian and languages of the Buddhist peoples of Russia (Kalmyk, Buryat, Tuvan, Altai (Oirat)). The project title of the plenary report by Alexey Maslov, President of the Foundation: "Buddhist terminology: from translation to interpretation on the example of the 'New Buddhist Encyclopedia' project". This report presented the Foundation's comprehensive Russian-language dictionary of Buddhist terminology, including terms from Sanskrit, Chinese, Japanese, Korean, Tibetan, and Mongolian. The project's objective is to develop a complete understanding of Buddhist philosophy, key Buddhist figures worldwide, and the regional diversity of Buddhism. The Foundation intends to collaborate with international specialists from Sri Lanka, India, China, and Myanmar in the project's implementation.
